Aldiana, The magic loop can replace the beginning slip ring or chain that is joined to form a ring on a pattern, so just follow your pattern. It may mean that you are working single crochet, double crochet or another variation into your ring to begin. It is really that simple!



Luci, no question is ever a dumb question! The magic loop is a technique that can be used for any number of stitches or any size yarn. Oftentimes patterns will direct you to begin with a slip ring or magic circle, in which case, the pattern will indicate the number of stitches you need to make. But if you are just 'winging it' working 8-10 stitches into the magic ring with a worsted weight is a good place to begin.

Marilyn, that is a very good question! I am overly careful when it comes to weaving in the tails on projects. When using the magic loop to begin a motif, I do crochet over the tail on the first round, but I also take a yarn needle and weave the tail in the opposite direction on the back to make it more secure. I also weave in all tails at least 3 inches. My rule is, take the time to do it right the first time and you'll not have to go back over your work later! As far as testing your motifs, I would give them a firm tug in all directions; if they stay together and the ends don't pop out, you're good to go!
